How to connect to EPL Wireless

This walkthrough was created to help staff and customers with the process of connecting to the EPL-Wireless.

Things to check before you start setting up the connection or troubleshooting.

- 1) Does the client have Administrator rights to the computer?
- 2) Newer computers and phones have an On/Off button that can disable Wireless access, is it turned on?
- 3) The device might have proprietary software that controls the wireless settings, choose proprietary.

The most common connection method is to click on **Start / Connect To / Wireless Network Connection**.



OR

Right click on the Wireless connection icon  on the Taskbar and click on **View Available Wireless Networks**.

Sometimes a message will appear letting you know that Wireless networks are found. You can also open the connection by clicking on the message. Notification window will now change to show that you have successfully connected to EPL-Public – Wireless.



All is left for customers to do is to open a browser and authenticate to the EPL wireless. No matter what their home page is they should be re-directed to <http://wireless.epl.ca> (page below).
