

Welcome to Lois Hole Library (Callingwood) _____

Since opening in 2008, Lois Hole Library has become a vital part of Callingwood North. The branch was named after the late Honourable Lois Hole, who was a champion of public libraries and former Lieutenant Governor of Alberta. This 25,000-square-foot, fully accessible branch sits at the heart of a lively community hub, alongside parks and rec centres in Ward sipiwiniwak. With more than 83,000 items in its collection and nearly 1,000 programs each year, Lois Hole Library offers a welcoming space to learn, connect, and grow.

Features and Spaces

Public Art

Lois Hole Library features a collection of artwork that honours its namesake and celebrates her enduring legacy as a passionate advocate for public libraries and community.

Inside the branch, a life-sized bronze monument by Danek Nozdzinski depicts Lois Hole seated on a bench, holding a book, as a warm and welcoming tribute created in 2007. Inside, an oil portrait by artists Izabella Orzelski-Konikowski and Bogdan Koral-Konikowski, originally donated by Her Honour and relocated from the Stanley A. Milner Library in 2018, is proudly displayed. A photographic portrait by Fred Katz also greets visitors at the entrance, offering a further reminder of Lois Hole's lasting impact.

Program Room

Located near the front of Lois Hole Library, the program room is bright, airy, and filled with natural light, making it a welcoming space for classes, meetings, and community gatherings.

A Bright, Sustainable Community Space

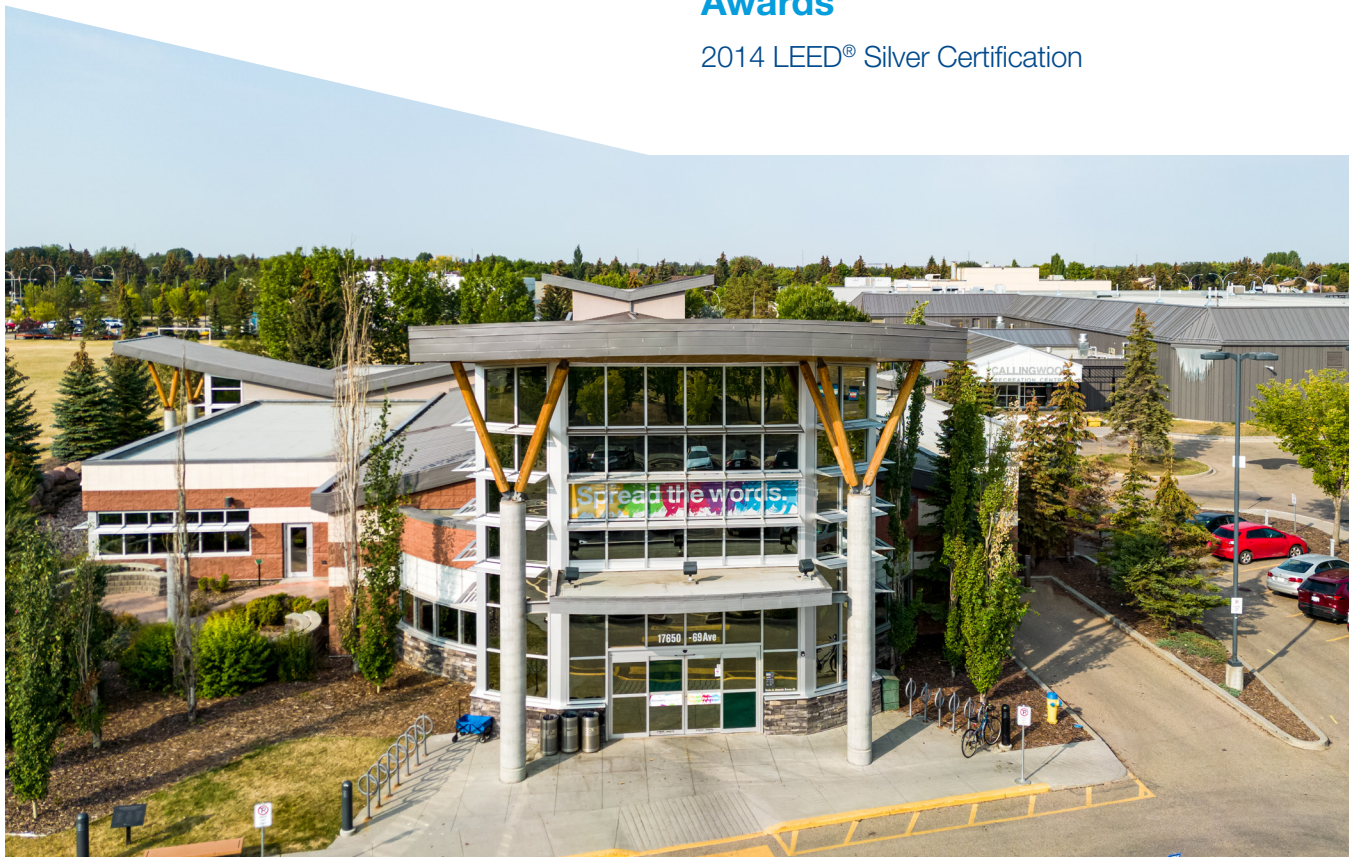
Lois Hole Library features cathedral-like ceilings that allow natural light to fill the space. Built around mature trees, the branch preserves the natural landscape.

Sustainable features include a highly reflective roof that reduces heat-island effects, operable windows integrated with an efficient HVAC system, and more than 75% natural daylight in occupied spaces.

With two enclosed study rooms, Lois Hole Library thoughtfully blends eco-conscious design with community needs in a welcoming, people-first space.
