Bugs and Numbers	Realistic and vibrant graphics aid in the visual learning premise of the game: for example, three bugs are on- screen when preschoolers are learning the numeral 3. Incorrect answers are met with an "Oops!" and kids can answer again and again with the app adjusting the difficulty level to suit the child's ability preventing frustration. There are three sections of six games each, for preschool, kindergarten, and elementary skill levels. Earn new bugs by completing each game. Little Bit Studio has several excellent apps for children in their repertoire. ThinkRolls 2	Kids can choose which level to start on once levels are unlocked through gameplay and choose from up to 32 fun characters. App may be set on easy or hard in the Parents section, with the ability to set up profiles for multiple players with different difficulty levels. It has Logical Physics Game that increases spatial awareness and introductory concepts such as density, force, electricity, gravity, friction, buoyancy and more! All the concepts are explained in the parent's section. Infinite do- overs at regular intervals, encouraging the trial-and-error method of experimentation, reducing potential for frustration and teaching patience and problem-solving. The parents section provides access to change how the letters are presented during gameplay. Each letter has an associated challenge to solve. A great real-life concept app: for example, if you run out of gas, the bus stops, and if you go over a bump too fast, your tire could be damaged! Draw with Curious George	Connect the dots, tracing, and coloring activities help develop fine motor skills. The Man with the Yellow Hat gives verbal directions which is helpful for pre-readers. Draw with Curious George includes an option for kids to share drawings, but only to email addresses entered within the locked parent portion of the app.	Fine motor skills, mark making. Dinosaur Train A to Z	The app is a dinosaur encyclopedia, initial download comes with 26 dinos and additional packs are available through in-store purchase. Kids interact with the app by choosing a letter on one of the train cars, or they can search by traits such as diet, or geologic era. They can feed the dinos to hear them roar or chirp. Put on PJ's, brush your teeth and turn off the lights, or turn the iPad and send everything tumbling. Kids can choose to put out a fire, drive a monster truck through bumpy terrain, use a crane to build structures, and then knock them down, or tow cars to a junkyard and stack them. Woofster introduces word families; Princess Presto matches letters to counts; Wonder Red matches words to pictures, Alpha Pig plays whack-a-word-family; and Super Why uses bumper cars labelled with letters and word families to create words.
